COVID-19 Case Trends - Omicron Variant

COVID-19 case rates continue to increase in Santa Cruz County. To reduce spread of COVID-19, it is now recommended that all individuals 5+ receive the COVID-19 vaccine and booster, and are required to wear a mask in indoor settings.

- As of 1/7/22, data shows a +121% change in average number of cases in the last 14 days, compared to two weeks ago when it was at a +4% change.
- Local hospitals are overwhelmed due to staffing shortages and increase in cases. COVID-19 hospitalizations, ICU utilization, and daily death rate are projected to increase over the next few weeks.
- The <u>Local Demographics Dashboard</u> shows that among active cases, the most number of cases are in the 25-34 age range (22.23%), followed by the 35-44 age range (14.72%).
- Among our active cases, most continue to be community acquired infections (80%) and exposed in their household (20%).


Testing

Testing Appointment Information is available at the <u>Santa Cruz County COVID-19 Testing Website</u>. The Mobile Testing Bus has updated their schedule:

- Santa Cruz City: Open Monday-Friday from 7am-7pm by appointment only at the Depot Freight building (119 Center Street).
- **Felton:** Located at Mountain Community Resources (6134 Highway 9). Open Friday-Tuesday from 10am-6pm.
- Ramsay Park: Open Wednesday-Sunday from 7am-6:45pm; closed 11am-12pm and 4pm-5pm.

For individuals taking a COVID-19 Rapid Antigen Test at home, it's important to follow <u>California Department of Public Health guidelines</u> and test instructions for reporting.



Vaccinations

On 1/6/2022, the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) approved the Center for Disease Control (CDC) recommendation of:

- Expanded eligibility of Pfizer-BioNtech Boosters for individuals 12-15;
- Booster doses for Pfizer now provided at a 5-month interval;
- and Expanded eligibility of Pfizer-BioNtech additional doses for immunocompromised individuals 5-11.
