COVID-19 Case Trends - Cases on the Rise

COVID-19 case rates have been increasing in Santa Cruz County. To reduce spread of COVID-19, it is now recommended that all individuals 5+ receive the COVID-19 vaccine and wear a mask in indoor settings.


- As of 12/1/21, data shows a +17% change in average number of cases in the last 14 days, compared to two weeks ago when it was at a -15% change.
- COVID-19 hospitalizations, ICU utilization, and daily death rate are no longer declining and are projected to be constant or increasing over the next few weeks.
- Majority of known cases since 7/1/2021 were exposed in the community (60.53%) or household (22.31%).
- The <u>Local Demographics Dashboard</u> shows that among active cases, the most number of cases are in the 25–34 age range (20.56%), followed by the 35–44 age range (16.11%).
- Two additional deaths attributed to COVID-19 were recently reported. Both were unvaccinated. The County offers its condolescences to the families.

Vaccinations

On 11/19/21, <u>California Department of Public Health</u> recommends COVID-19 Vaccine Booster doses for those who have completed a primary series and meet the following criteria:

- A booster dose for those who received a Pfizer or Moderna primary series is recommended if you:
 - Received your second dose at least 6 months ago,
 - Are 18 years or older
- A booster dose for those who received a Johnson and Johnson is recommended if you:
 - Received your first dose at least 2 months ago,
 - Are 18 years or older
