
COVID-19 Case Trends - Daily Case Counts Surpass Last Summer's Surge

The COVID-19 Delta Variant is active in the Santa Cruz County community and throughout the country. This strain is more transmissible than prior variants of the virus, may cause more severe illness, and even fully vaccinated individuals can spread the virus to others.

- As of 8/18, data modeling shows a 64% increase in cases. Now averaging 40 cases per day, surpassing daily counts from last summer.
- Past surges have lasted 3-4 months.
 Based on how the Delta variant behaved in India and Great Britain, we expect this surge to last through October.
- Hospitalizations are expected to increase.
 Hospitals are full, but not all are due to
 COVID-19 cases. Hospital capacity is
 impacted by significant healthcare
 staffing shortages
- Case Trends: as of 8/19, there are 824
 Active Known Cases. New cases are typically...
 - Acquiring COVID-19 through community exposure.
 - North and South County residents, White/Caucasian, 25-50-year-olds.

State Public Health Officer Orders and Guidelines

- On 8/16/2021, a <u>State Order</u> was released on the <u>Hospital and Health</u> Care System Surge.
- On 8/18/2021, CDPH updated their <u>Blueprint guidance</u> for **Industry and Business sectors**, including vaccine and testing guidelines for mega-events involving 1,000+ participants.



Vaccinations & Testing

In addition to local health partners providing weekly vaccination and testing, the Public Health Division continues to support weekly vaccination pop-up clinics and access to Optum Serve Testing Sites available at no-cost to the community.
